I trust that you had a good summer and I would like to welcome you back to our new academic year 2013-2014. I have always been enthusiastic about the beginning of school. Even as a child the start of the school year meant new things, like new uniforms, new stationery, a new classroom, new teachers, meeting new students as well as connecting back with old friends. This is a great time to start with a new outlook. However, many school counselors are not trained in the use of play therapy techniques during their graduate training programs as Play Therapy is not a required course based on standards set by the Council for Accreditation of Counseling and Related Education Programs (CACREP 2009). Indeed, while there are over 400 school counseling programs in the U.S., there are only 11 certified play therapy training centers. Even more critically, school counselors may not know which play therapy approaches and interventions are evidenced based for specific childhood concerns, e.g., selective mutism, social skills deficits, parent deployment. Play therapy is a structured, theoretically based approach to counseling that builds on the normal communicative and learning processes of children as they may not have developed the complexities of language to accurately express their concerns (Carmichael 2006, Gil 1991, Landreth 2002, O'Connor).
