acquired income and wealth of all citizens should be progressively taxed away or supplemented by the state so that the eventual result is more though never perfect equality This objective he asserts must be radically distinguished from old fashioned without prefix or suffix justice It was this type of justice Adam Smith referred to when he famously said that it is a virtue of which the observance is not left to the freedom of our wills but which may be extorted by force Flew question the aims of those who would discredit wealth creators and wealth creating investment showing that these are the same people who prom
