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The Fashion of Architecture Bradley Quinn, 2003 Architecture is making its presence felt in cutting edge fashion The pliable metals membrane structures lightweight glasses and plastics used in building construction are creeping onto the catwalk As they do so their impact on recent textile developments has produced fabrics that enable clothing to act as individual climate controlled environments that can exchange information with embedded sensors resulting in wearable dwellings that act as both shelter and clothing At the same time architects are borrowing the techniques of pleating stapling cutting and draping from traditional tailoring to design buildings that are flexible interactive inflatable and even portable Although the relationship between architecture and fashion was recognized more than a century ago the connection between them has rarely been explored by historians designers or practicing architects.
