- The title of your essay will be centered, with only regular double spacing separating it from the first line of the essay.
 - NOT UNDERLINED
 - NOT BOLD
 - NOT ALL CAPS
 - NOT ITALICIZED
- When you mention other titles in your essay:
 - Italicize: Books, plays, periodicals, radio and television programs, and other independently published works.
 - "Quote marks": Articles, essays, short stories, short poems, chapters of books, individual episodes of television and radio programs, and other works published within larger works.
