Strategy 1: The Comma Method

USE IT WHEN:

a "speaking verb" (responds, says, observes, explains, interjects, etc.)

OR a speaking verb followed by a prepositional phrase (says to _____)
comes **directly** before the quotation.

NOTE: In this method, data should begin with a **CAPITAL** letter. Lead-in ends with a comma.

Comma Method 1

(Name of character) says, "_____" (citation).

Example:

Yertle says, "I'm ruler of all that I see. But I don't see enough. That's the trouble with me" (Seuss 1).
