Toulmin model Essay Example

The Toulmin model is made up of six elements. The elements include: claim, ground, warrant, backing, rebuttal, and qualification. Qualification provides the specifications outlining limits to a claim, backing and warrant. Rebuttal represents exceptions due to a claim. This is represented by counter-examples and counter arguments. Backing is offering support to justify a position.

Warrant indicates the reasoning that links the grounds to a claim. The grounds present evidence in support of a claim. Finally, a claim is a position on which an argument is premised.[1] On the basis of this, one gets the feeling that Toulmin was trying to induce the element of morality while arguing in support of something.
