



Textual Evidence

Textual evidence refers to specific details, examples, quotes, or information taken directly from a text that supports or substantiates a claim, interpretation, or argument.

It is the use of concrete references from the text to provide evidence for the conclusions or assertions made in discussions, analyses, or written responses.

Significance of Citing Evidence

Establishing Credibility

When we cite textual evidence, we demonstrate that our conclusions are not based on unsupported claims.

Strengthening Logical Reasoning

Citing evidence adds a layer of logical reasoning to our arguments that we have examined the text critically.

Demonstrating Engagement

Citing textual evidence demonstrates our engagement with the text and our ability to comprehend and analyze its content.

Dialogue and Collaboration

Citing textual evidence opens up opportunities for meaningful discussions and collaborative learning.

Citing Direct Quotes

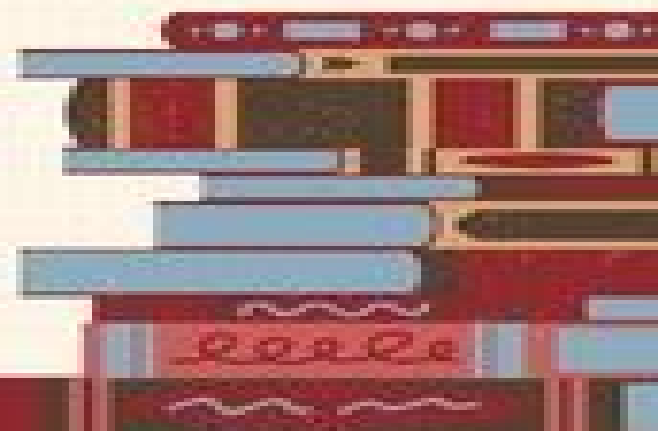
Example 1: "The sun rose slowly, casting a golden glow over the tranquil meadow" (Aguirre, 201).

Paraphrasing

Example 2: In the his world, there is a sense of rebellion at the unfolding events (O'Brien, 45).

Cited Evidence and Argument

Example 3: The description of the sunset in the meadow sets a peaceful tone (Aguirre, 201). This supports the theme of finding solace in nature.
