Yiddish Scientific Institute to purchase arms for the ghetto's secret partisan organization. All the while both men wrote poetry that was recited and sung by the fast dwindling population of ghetto inhabitants. With the Soviet liberation of Vilna now known as Vilnius, the Paper Brigade thought themselves and their precious cultural treasures saved, only to learn that their new masters were no more welcoming toward Jewish culture than the old, and the books must now be smuggled out of the USSR.
