TNM classification of malignant tumours 7th edition: what's new for head and neck?

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The TNM System for the classification of malignant tumours was developed by Pierre Denoix, France, between 1943 and 1952. After international consultation, the system was adopted for clinical use by the UICC (International Union Against Cancer) Committee on Tumour Nomenclature and Statistics in 1953. In 1958, larynx and breast were the first anatomic sites to have site-specific clinical stages. Since then, seven editions of the classification have been published.

The TNM system has delivered considerable benefits by standardising the description and reporting of cancers worldwide. It is primarily an anatomic/morphologic system that helps prognosticate by documenting the disease burden at the primary site, the neck and distant metastases. The system however has been challenged for not encompassing other factors that have been found to have a significant bearing on tumour behaviour, such as concurrent co-morbidity and unique tumour characteristics. In the latter situation for example, over 15 different malignant salivary gland pathologies share a single generic system designed to stage all salivary gland malignancies.

It has been 7 years since the last edition of TNM. However, most head and neck clinicians will be pleased to hear that there are only minor changes in the classification system for head and neck cancers, compared to the more extensive overhaul that took place with the 6th edition. The main thrust behind the current edition (TNM 7)¹ has been the recent advances in personalisation of prognostication in some cancer sites.

The trend towards improving the prognostic efficacy of TNM by including of markers of poor prognosis, other than stage, is likely to continue. The current edition incorporates grade of histological differentiation for oesophageal cancer, and PSA (prostate specific antigen) and the Gleason score for prostate cancer. As knowledge expands on the role of human papillomawirus status in head and neck cancer, it would be hoped that this could to be incorporated into the prognostic system of head neck cancers, especially in oropharyngeal cancer.² Comorbidity has been shown to have a significant impact on prognosis and is another candidate for inclusion.³

New classifications

This new edition has major changes in six cameer sites (oesophagus, stomach, lung, skin, vulva and prostate). There are nine new classifications including melanoma of the upper aerodigestive tract, gastroinnestinal stromal tumours, appendix, neuroendocrine tumours (of the stomach, intestines, appendix, pancreas and lung), intrahepatic cholangiocarcinoma, Merkel cell carcinoma, uterine sarcomas and adrenal cortex tumours. The addition of Mucosal malignant melanomas is especially significant for the otolaryngology community, who have known for a long time that the behaviour of mucosal melanoma of the head and neck differs from skin melanoma. Reflecting the aggressive nature of this disease, no stage I and II mucosal melanomas are recognised. Tumour of any size limited to the epithelium is stage 3 disease (Table I).

Generic changes

There have also been some changes that affect all cancer sites. The Mx category (distant metastases not assessed) has been removed. This has been done to ensure that fewer patients are excluded from the overall staging, as it is now judged that physical examination alone is sufficient to assess evidence of metastases in several body systems. The pMX category also has been removed. If clinical and radiological assessments show no metastases, the M stage should be recorded as cM0. When clinically detected metastases (cM1) are proven to be non-cancerous on histology, the patient should be restaged as cM0 and not pM0; the latter category exists only at autopsy. The pM1 category is to be used only when metastases are proven histologically.

Clarifications of histopathological reporting have also been included as optional descriptors. Perineural invasion (Pn1) has been added, in addition to lymphatic and venous invasion seen in the previous edition. Tumour deposits that are consistent with having replaced a lymph node completely are now to be recorded as a lymph node and should upstage the N stage as appropriate.
