

**Red Mulberry**

Morus rubra To 60 ft. (18 m)
Most leaves are 3-lobed, oval or mitten-shaped. Elongate fruit is edible.

**Green Ash**

Fraxinus pennsylvanica To 60 ft. (18 m)
Leaves have 7-9 leaflets. Flowers are succeeded by single-winged fruits.

**Water Oak**

Quercus nigra To 100 ft. (30 m)
Wedge-shaped leaves are widest near the tip and up to 5 in. (13 cm) long.

**Live Oak**

Quercus virginiana To 50 ft. (15 m)
Note short trunk and huge, spreading crown. Stiff leaves are leathery and have rolled edges.

**American Holly**

Ilex opaca To 70 ft. (21 m)
Tree or shrub is distinguished by its stiff, spiny evergreen leaves and red, poisonous berries.

**Southern Magnolia**

Magnolia grandiflora To 80 ft. (24 m)
Large creamy flowers, to 8 in. (20 cm) in diameter, have 9-14 petals. Cone-like, hairy fruits have bright red seeds.

**American Elm**

Ulmus americana To 100 ft. (30 m)
Note vase-shaped profile. Leaves are toothed. Fruits have a papery collar and are notched at the tip.

**Red Maple**

Acer rubrum To 90 ft. (27 m)
Leaves have 3-5 lobes and turn scarlet in autumn. Flowers are succeeded by red, winged seed pairs.

**Boxelder**

Acer negundo To 90 ft. (18 m)
Leaves have 3-7 leaflets. Seeds are encased in paired papery keys.

**Sweetbay Magnolia**

Magnolia virginiana To 60 ft. (18 m)
Shiny, papery leaves are blunt-tipped. Cup-shaped flowers are fragrant.

**Baldcypress**

Taxodium distichum To 120 ft. (36.5 m)
Note flaring trunk. Leaves are flattened and feathery. Protruding root "knees" help to stabilize the tree in wet areas.

**Common Hackberry**

Celtis occidentalis To 90 ft. (27 m)
Leaves are slightly toothed and curved at the tip. The bark is very corky to warty in appearance.

**Honey Locust**

Gleditsia triacanthos To 80 ft. (24 m)
Leaves have 7-15 pairs of leaflets. Thorn size up to 10 in. (25 cm). Twisted fruits are up to 16 in. (40 cm) long.

**Chinese Tallow**

Sapium sebiferum To 40 ft. 12 m
Leaves are waxy. Long flower spikes are succeeded by waxy 3-lobed fruits that turn brown-black as they age. Non-native, invasive.

**Southern Catalpa**

Catalpa bignonioides To 50 ft. (15 m)
Tree has heart-shaped leaves, large clusters of flowers and a beanlike fruit.

**Overcup Oak**

Quercus lyrata To 80 ft. (24 m)
Cup of acorn almost encloses the entire fruit.

**Water Hickory**

Carya aquatica To 100 ft. (30 m)

**Elderberry**

Sambucus nigra To 30 ft. (10 m)

**Teaweed**

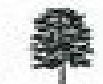
Sida acuta To 3 ft. (90 cm)

**Black Willow**

Salix nigra To 100 ft. (30 m)
Tree or shrub, often leaning. Slender leaves are shiny green on the upper surface. Flowers bloom in long, fuzzy clusters.

**Black Tupelo**

Nyssa sylvatica To 100 ft. (30 m)
Glossy leaves turn red in autumn. Blue fruits have ridged seeds.

**Laurel Oak**

Quercus laurifolia To 80 ft. (24 m)
Alternate, shiny leaves remain on tree until late in winter. Acorn cup is saucer-shaped.

**Chinaberry**

Melia azadirach To 150 ft. (45 m)
Non-native, invasive.

**Pumpkin Ash**

Fraxinus profunda To 100 ft. (30 m)

**Chinese Privet**

Ligustrum sinense To 23 ft. (7 m)
Non-native, invasive.
