


**Bright Child News**



Singer, 2015-03-04 Children at War is the first comprehensive book to examine the growing and global use of children as soldiers P W Singer an internationally recognized expert in twenty first century warfare explores how a new strategy of war utilized by armies and warlords alike has targeted children seeking to turn them into soldiers and terrorists Singer writes

about how the first American serviceman killed by hostile fire in Afghanistan a Green Beret was shot by a fourteen year old Afghan boy how suspected militants detained by U S forces in Iraq included more than one hundred children under the age of seventeen and how hundreds who were taken hostage in Thailand were held captive by the rebel God's Army led by twelve year old twins Interweaving the voices of child soldiers throughout the book Singer looks at the ways these children are recruited abducted trained and finally sent off to fight in war torn hot spots from Colombia and the Sudan to Kashmir and Sierra Leone He writes about children who have been indoctrinated to fight U S forces in Iraq and Afghanistan of Iraqui boys between the ages of ten and fifteen who had been trained in military arms and tactics to become Saddam Hussein's Ashbal Saddam Lion Cubs of young refugees from Pakistani madrassahs who were recruited to help bring the Taliban to power in the Afghan civil war The author National Security Fellow at the Brookings Institution and director of the Brookings Project on U S Policy Towards the Islamic World explores how this phenomenon has come about and how social disruptions and failures of development in modern Third World nations have led to greater global conflict and an instability that has spawned a new pool of recruits He writes about how technology has made today s weapons smaller and lighter and therefore easier for children to carry and handle how one billion people in the world live in developing countries where civil war is part of everyday life and how some children without food clothing or family have volunteered as soldiers as their only way to survive Finally Singer makes clear how the U S government and the international community must face this new reality of modern warfare how those who benefit from the recruitment of children as soldiers must be held accountable how Western militaries must be prepared to face children in battle and how rehabilitation programs can undo this horrific phenomenon and turn child soldiers back into children The Fluent Reader Timothy V. **United States Safe and Secure** Christina Elston, 1998 Keeping a child safe and secure is a parent s biggest challenge Christina Elston health editor of L A PARENT magazine and mother of a six year old has compiled a comprehensive guide to child safety Points covered for each stage of child development include food school strangers computers and television and Between the Street and the State Caitlin Reed Wiesner, 2025-09-16 Deepens our understanding of Black women s more anti rape activism by attending to how their tactics shifted in response to the federal War on Crime Beginning in the 1970s a series of government agencies established to carry out the federal war on crime offered financial and ideological support to the fledgling feminist movement against sexual violence These entities promoted the carceral tactics of policing prosecution and punishment as the only viable means of controlling rape and they expected anti-rape organizers to embrace them Yet Black women anti rape organizers viewed police as a source of violence within their communities not a solution to it Between the Street and the State examines how Black anti rape organizers critically engaged both the feminist movement against sexual violence and the federal War on Crime between 1974 and 1994 In Philadelphia Washington DC the Bay Area Chicago and Atlanta activists inflected Black women's longstanding tradition of community based caring labor with the Black feminist condemnation of patriarchal and state violence Their multifaceted and adaptable brand of anti-rape advocacy was premised on sustaining the survival of Black women and girls individually and Black communities more broadly In this way Black anti rape activists countered the growing emphasis within the feminist movement on controlling rape through carceral collaborations. Mallon, Peg McCartt Hess, 2014-09-09 The Adoption and Safe Families Act ASFA which became law in 1997 elicited a major shift in federal policy and thinking toward child welfare emphasizing children's safety permanency and well being over preserving biological ties at all costs. The first edition of this volume mapped the field of child welfare after ASFA's passage detailing the practices policies programs and research affected by the legislation's new attitude toward care. This second edition highlights the continuously changing child welfare climate in the US including content on the Fostering Connections Act of 2008. The authors have updated the text throughout drawing from real world case examples and data obtained from the national Child and Family Services Reviews and emerging empirically based practices. They have also added chapters addressing child welfare workforce issues supervision and research and evaluation. The volume is divided into four sections child and adolescent well being child and adolescent safety permanency for children and adolescents and systemic issues within services policies and programs. Recognized scholars practitioners and policy makers discuss meaningful engagement with families particularly Latino families health care for children and youth including mental health care effective practices with LGBT youth and their families placement stability foster parent recruitment and retention and the challenges of working with immigrant children youth and families

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
