William Golding's novel, *Lord of the Flies*, tells a story of young boys stranded on an island with no adults. They go through many different obstacles through the story and without adults around the boys lose their innocence. In *Everything I Never Told You*, written by Celeste Ng, a sixteen-year-old named Lydia is found dead in a lake. Her family is left with many unanswered questions and are left to unravel them. Sylvia Plath's *The Bell Jar*, tells the story of Esther Greenwood, a college student whose dream is to become a poet.
