Silent Heroes Sherri Greene Ottis, 2014-07-11 In the early years of World War II it was an amazing feat for an Allied airman shot down over occupied Europe to make it back to England By 1943 however pilots and crewmembers supplied with escape kits knew they had a 50 percent chance of evading capture and returning home An estimated 12 000 French civilians helped make this possible More than 5 000 airmen many of them American successfully traveled along escape lines organized much like those of the U S Underground Railroad using secret codes and stopping in safe houses If caught they risked internment in a POW camp But the French Belgian and Dutch civilians who aided them risked torture and even death Sherri Ottis writes candidly about the pilots and crewmen who walked out of occupied Europe as well as the British intelligence agency in charge of Escape and Evasion But her main focus is on the helpers those patriots who have been all but ignored in English language books and journals To research their stories Ottis hiked the Pyrenees and interviewed many of the survivors She tells of the extreme difficulty they had in avoiding Nazi infiltration by double agents of their creativity in hiding evaders in their homes sometimes in the midst of unexpected searches of their generosity in sharing their meager food supplies during wartime and of their unflagging spirit and courage in the face of a war fought on a very personal level

& Space Power Journal sum 02 , **After D-Day** Robert Lynn Fuller, 2021-02-24 After D Day is one of a small but growing body of works that examine the Allied liberators of France This study focuses on both the French experience of the U S Army and the American soldiers reaction to the French during the liberation and its immediate aftermath Drawing on French and American archival materials as well as dozens of memoirs diaries letters and newspapers Robert Lynn Fuller follows French and American interactions starting in the skies over France in 1942 and ending with the liberation of Alsace in 1945 Fuller

pays special attention to French life in the war zones where living under constant shelling offered a miserable experience for those forced to endure it. The French stoically withstood those travails sometimes inflicted by the Americans when they saw their sacrifices as the price of liberation and victory over Germany. As Fuller shows when the French did not believe afflictions brought by the Americans advanced the cause of success, their tolerance waned sometimes dramatically. Fuller maintains that the Allied bombing of France was an important yet often overlooked chapter of World War II, one that inflicted more death and destruction than the ground war still to come. Yet the ground campaign which began with the Allied invasion of Normandy unleashed enormous violence that killed, injured or rendered homeless tens of thousands of French civilians. Fuller examines French and American records of the fate of civilians in the principal battle zones, Normandy and Lorraine, as well as in overlooked liberated regions such as Orléans and Champagne that largely escaped widespread damage and casualties. Despite French gratitude toward the Americans for the liberation of their country, relations began to cool in the fall and winter of 1944 as progress on the battlefield slowed and then appeared to reverse with the German offensive in the Ardennes. Revealing in stark detail the experiences of French civilians with the American military, *After D Day* presents a compelling coda to our understanding of the Allied conquest of German occupied France.

Forgotten Casualties Kevin T Hall, 2023-08-01. Sheds new light on the mistreatment of downed airmen during World War II and the overall relationship between the air war and state sponsored violence. Throughout the vast expanse of the Pacific, the remoteness of Southeast Asia, and the rural and urban communities in Nazi occupied Europe, more than 120,000 American airmen were shot down over enemy territory during World War II, thousands of whom were mistreated and executed. The perpetrators were not just solely fanatical soldiers or Nazi zealots, but also ordinary civilians. Triggered by the death and devastation inflicted by the war, in *Forgotten Casualties* author Kevin T Hall examines Axis violence inflicted on downed Allied airmen during this global war. Compared with all other armed conflicts, World War II exhibited the most widespread and ruthless violence committed against airmen. Flyers were deemed guilty because of their association with the Allied air forces, and their fate remained in the hands of their often hostile captors. Axis citizens, angered by the devastation inflicted by the war along with the regimes' consent and often encouragement of citizens to take matters into their own hands, resulted in thousands of Allied flyers being mistreated and executed by enraged civilians. Written to help advance the relatively limited discourse on the mistreatment against flyers in World War II, *Forgotten Casualties* is the first book to analyze the Axis violence committed against Allied airmen in a comparative international perspective. Effectively comparing and contrasting the treatment of POWs in Germany with that of their counterparts in Japan, Hall's thorough analysis of rarely seen primary and secondary sources sheds new light on the largely overlooked complex relationship among the air war, propaganda, the role of civilians, and state sponsored terror during the radicalized conflict. Sources include postwar trial testimonies, Missing Air Crew Reports, MACR, Escape and Evasion reports, perpetrators' explanations and rationalizations for their actions, extensive judicial sources, transcripts of court

Atwood, 2011 Twenty six stories of women heroes from World War II *Terror Flyers* Kevin T Hall, 2021-01-19 *Terror Flyers* examines the lynch justice Lynchjustiz committed against American airmen in Nazi Germany during World War II Using engaging first person accounts of downed pilots as well as previously unused primary sources *Terror Flyers* challenges the notion that such lynchings were exclusively the domain of Nazi party officials and soldiers New evidence reveals ordinary German people executed Lynchjustiz as well Initially occurring as a spontaneous reaction to the devastation of the Allied air campaign against the cities of the Third Reich Lynchjustiz offered the Nazi regime a unique propaganda opportunity to harness the outrage of the German population Fueled by inspiration from America's own history of the lynching of African Americans Nazi propaganda exploited the very same imagery found in US publications to escalate the anger of the German people Drawing heavily on the accounts of the downed airmen themselves testimonies from the flyer trials held in Dachau during 1945-48 and rarely seen Nazi propaganda *Terror Flyers* offers a new narrative of this previously overlooked aspect of the Allied campaign in Europe and suggests that at least 3 000 cases of lynch justice likely occurred between 1943 and 1945

Secret Agent, Unsung Hero Peter Dowding, Ken Spillman, 2023-12-30 Young Australian teacher Bruce Dowding arrived in Paris in 1938 planning only to improve his understanding of French language and culture *Secret Agent Unsung Hero* draws on decades of research to reveal for the first time his coming of age as a leader in escape and evasion during World War II Dowding helped exfiltrate hundreds of Allied servicemen from occupied France and paid the ultimate price He was beheaded by the Nazis just after his 29th birthday in 1943 *The Caretakers* Caitlin Galante DeAngelis, 2024-01-16 When World War I ended hundreds of British veterans stayed in France to work for the newly chartered Imperial War Graves Commission Through the 1920s and 1930s these veteran gardeners married local women raised bilingual children and dedicated themselves to caring for the graves of their fallen comrades When World War II swept through Europe in 1940 more than 200 War Graves gardeners were stranded in Nazi occupied France Their bosses explicitly ordered them to remain at their posts even when their villages were under attack by the invading Germans While some escaped others were arrested by the Nazis A handful managed to stay free and join the French Resistance With their English language skills and unshakable loyalty to the Allied cause the gardeners and their families took on crucial roles in the effort to save British and American airmen shot down in France In some cases they hid the airmen in World War I cemeteries In *The Caretakers* internationally renowned cemetery expert Caitlin Galante DeAngelis tells the true story of three of these unlikely heroes Ben Leech a barman from Manchester who became a cemetery gardener in Beaumont Hamel and joined the Resistance Rosine Witton the wife of a British gardener who served as a key conductor on the famous Comet Line and survived Ravensbrück and

Robert Armstrong an Irish gardener who worked for the Resistance until he was captured by the Nazis and sentenced to death Through meticulous research never before published journals and papers and compassionate storytelling DeAngelis honors the sacrifices made by War Graves gardeners and their families *The Blister Club* Michael Lee Lanning,2021-10-01 During World War II some 10 000 American bombers and fighters were shot down over Europe Of the crews aboard 26 000 men were killed while 30 000 survived being shot down only to be captured and made prisoners of war Against the longest of odds nearly 3 000 airmen made it to the ground alive evaded capture and escaped to safety These men proudly called themselves the Blister Club Drawing on tens of thousands of pages of mostly untapped documents in the National Archives Michael Lee Lanning tells the story of these courageous airmen They had received escape and evasion E E training and some were lucky enough to land with their E E kits but all bets were off once they hit the ground They landed after an air catastrophe The geography was usually unfamiliar Civilians might or might not be trustworthy German soldiers and Gestapo agents hunted down airmen as well as civilians who dared help them If an airman abandoned his uniform for civilian garb he forfeited Geneva Convention protections Most faced the daunting task of escaping on foot across hundreds of miles The fortunate connected with one of the established escape routes to Spain or Switzerland or across the English Channel or they hooked up with the underground resistance or friendly civilians Upon return to friendly lines these men were often able to provide valuable intelligence about enemy troop dispositions and civilian morale Many volunteered to fly again even though regulations prohibited it The Blister Club is history with a punch With a historian s eye Lanning covers the hows and whys of escape and evasion and aerial combat in the European theater but the book also vividly captures the stories of the airmen who did the escaping and evading including that of a young pilot named Chuck Yeager who during his own escape aided the French Resistance and helped another downed airman to safety and then begged to fly again eventually securing Eisenhower s approval to return to the air where he achieved ace status Stories of escape are popular especially those set during World War II as are stories of the war in the air Combining both of these *The Blister Club* should find an enthusiastic audience
