Voltaire's Romances Voltaire,2016-05-05 Born on November 21 1694 in Paris France Voltaire was exiled to Tulle in 1715 Two years later in 1717 he returned to Paris only to be arrested and exiled to the Bastille for a year He was sent to the Bastille again in 1726 before being shipped off to England In 1733 he fled to Lorraine and in 1759 he wrote the satirical novella *Candide* In 1778 Voltaire returned to Paris where he died there on May 30 of that year
