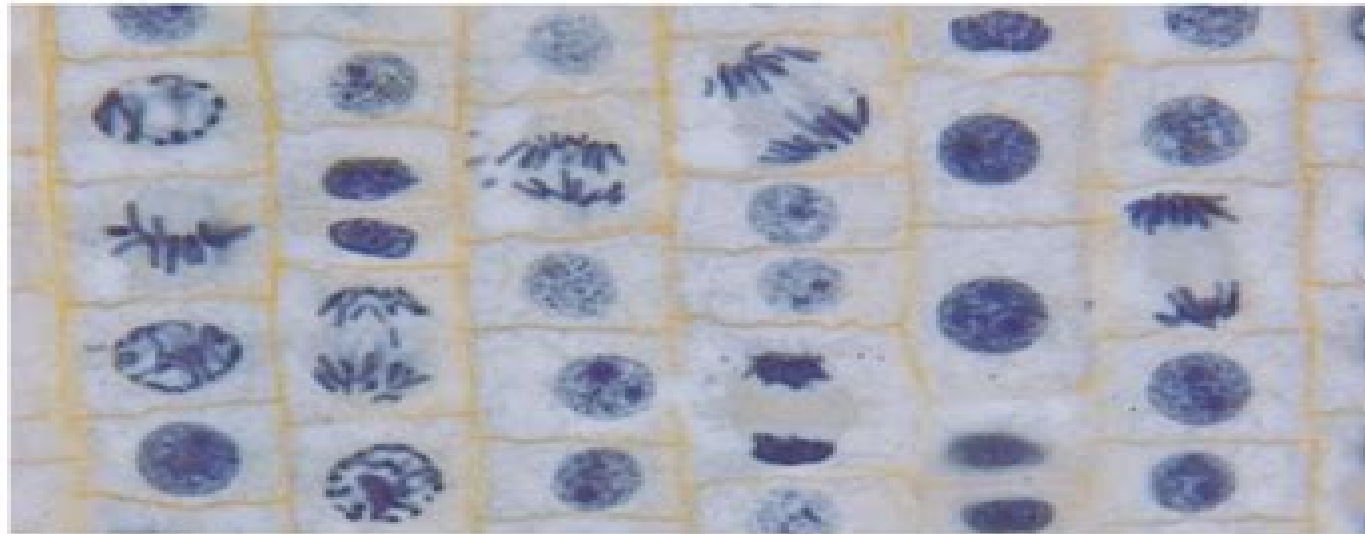


Read "Laboratory 15" in your lab manual and carefully study the diagrams.

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Figure 1: Onion Root Micrograph. There are 30 cells visible in this micrograph of an onion root. There are 5 cells in each of the six columns of cells at various stages of their cell cycles.

There are 24 hours in a day. This is 1,440 minutes. Onion root cells take this long to complete their cell cycle. You can calculate the time spent in each stage using the equation below.

Percentage of time in each stage in decimal form X 1,440 minutes = minutes of time in each stage

* There are only 24 hours in a day and onion cells take that long to complete their cell cycles. This means the column labeled "Hours Spent in Each Stage" must add up to ~24 hours.
