Book - Story Sequencing: picture & text sequencing with 10 picture pages - Sequencing with 10 Why/How questions with 10 picture pages - 10 story questions with 10 picture pages

1. Story Sequencing

As you look through the book together, read each page then ask simple questions about the relevant story sequencing picture and read the text aloud. Ask the children to answer in a random order and see if your child can sequence them by asking - "What Comes next in the story?" 3-4 pictures until the end. Expect your child to be at least able "What" or "How" with the 3 sets of sequencing pictures and text.

The Tiny Seed: Sequencing Activities

1. Sunflower Puzzle

Introduce sequencing puzzle with 10 pieces cut out from front cover and last back cover to match picture pieces to their parts and to prepare for sequencing. Show the (empty) wooden puzzle board and spread out all the 10 puzzle pieces and then say, "Let's see how a sunflower grows!" Present the first page of the front cover and last back cover, and talk through the first (2) pictures e.g. "First, the seed in the earth grows a short stem and little leaves!" Then encourage your child to find the puzzle piece that matches the picture. (ask place it first on top of the picture, then into the wooden puzzle board) Then talk through the next (2) pictures, encourage your child to find the matching puzzle piece to place on the picture then into the wooden puzzle board. Continue with the next (2) pictures and matching puzzle pieces, and the last (4) pictures with the 4 matching puzzle pieces, until the puzzle is complete.

2. Sequencing Plant Growth and Seasons

From front cover and back cover cut pieces of 4 sets of 4 pictures to sequence. Show the back cover and the first set of 4 plant growth pictures, placed on the table randomly. (ask "Where's going to be two four plants grow?" and encourage your child to place on the appropriate part of the back cover, sequencing on each stage. Do this same for all 3 sets (sunflower, apple tree, rosebush) then read with the Seasonal pictures, sequencing them in sequence in order and preparing for what happens in the time in each season.

The Tiny Seed: Some & Different

Sunflower and Cactus Picture with Subboard of Sunflower number 1-5

Present the Picture of the sunflower and the cactus, pointing out the sun and rain and asking the different parts you can see together: roots, stem, leaves, flower etc.

Then show the subboard and present the backboard with a choice of relevant statements for each number 1-5.

Read out the photograph of one of the no. 1 seeds and ask which picture it looks like, then do the same with the other no. 1 photograph. Move on to no. 2 and continue to the end.

Correct if the wrong one is chosen, by talking through.

Use this activity to support the questions on the story sequencing activity which prompt for:

- "What does a plant need to grow?"
- "How does a cactus grow in the desert?"
- "What's the same about a sunflower and a cactus?"
