

in this study are aged between ten and twenty one and are socially economically and politically dependent on their parents or guardians To further complicate matters the experiences of girls of colour are more complex than those encountered by white adolescents As the typical conflicts within the family problems with gender sexual development education and friends are juxtaposed with issues of racism and very often a lower social status In the light of these facts it does not come as a surprise that many ethnic adolescent girls have problems finding their self.
