Westward Expansion Readers

Lewis and Clark, together with a team, set off on the 14th May, 1804 to explore the Louisiana Territory. They fought against the current in a barge and two horses, they used long poles and ropes to push the barge and move them away from the banks. It took the group around one and a half years to reach the Pacific Ocean, arriving in November 1805. On their return journey only took six months, with the group home again in March 1806.

President Abraham Lincoln's Railroad Act in 1862 authorized lines to be built across the country while the Union fought the Civil War. The two main lines were the Union Pacific and the Central Pacific.

between the Republic of San Antonio in Texas and the Mexican government. The Mexican government declared their independence and kept it back.



The California Gold Rush in 1848, ending in 1855. In time, many people from all around the world came to California in an effort to find gold and 'strike it rich'. Miners would move to a place chasing gold, but camps to live in. These would then end up like after the miners left town.

Westward Expansion was initiated by the Louisiana Purchase in 1803 when the U.S. President, Thomas Jefferson, purchased a large amount of land from the French government. Known as the Louisiana Territory, the land was located west of the Mississippi River all the way to the Rocky Mountains.



Most Americans believed that this expansion to the west was their destiny, and this became known as the Manifest Destiny.

Trail was one of the most difficult things to do when they traveled. The trails were miles long, and had that could also be anywhere from complete.



Miners needed tools like a mining pan, shovel, food, shelter and every day living supplies.

Some miners worked together, able to search larger amounts of gravel for gold using a tool known as a rocker or cradle.



Wagons which were pulled by horses, mules or oxen. Constructed from wood, they were covered with a waterproof canvas. Due to the size of these wagons, only necessary supplies such as clothing, food and tools were taken.
