The event that sets the story in motion

CLIMAX
The most intense moment in the story

DENOUEMENT
The final outcome of the story

RIISING ACTION
The part of the story where the conflict develops

FALLING ACTION
The part of the story where the conflict begins to resolve

CONFLICT
The struggle between two or more characters or forces

RESOLUTION
The part of the story where the conflict is resolved

EXPOSITION
The part of the story where the background is established

MAN VS. MAN
Conflict between two characters

MAN VS. SELF
Conflict within a character

MAN VS. NATURE
Conflict between a character and the natural world

MAN VS. SOCIETY
Conflict between a character and the social norms or expectations of a group

PLOT
The sequence of events in a story

SETTING
The time and place of the story

CHARACTERS
The people or animals in a story

DYNAMIC CHARACTER
A character who changes over the course of the story

ROUND CHARACTER
A character who is fully developed and has a role in the story

STATIC CHARACTER
A character who does not change over the course of the story

FLAT CHARACTER
A character who is not fully developed and has a minor role in the story

CHARACTER TRAITS
The qualities or characteristics of a character

DIALOGUE
The conversation between two or more characters

FORESHADOWING
A hint or suggestion of what is to come later in the story

FLASHBACK
A scene or event that is shown to have occurred at an earlier time

MOOD
The feeling or atmosphere created by the story

TOPE
The attitude or feeling of the writer or speaker

ATMOSPHERE
The overall feeling or mood of a story or scene

NARRATOR
The person or entity that tells the story

POINT OF VIEW
The perspective from which the story is told

1ST PERSON POV
The story is told from the perspective of a character who is directly involved in the events

2ND PERSON POV
The story is told from the perspective of a character who is not directly involved in the events

3RD PERSON POV
