what is theme?

A message or lesson from the story that you can apply to your own life.

- It's the lesson or message the author wants you to learn from the story.
- The author won't explicitly state it - you often have to infer the theme.
- There can be more than one theme.
- It's not specific to the story you are reading.
- The theme is universal. It applies to everyone.



Let's use this text as an example

Being excluded makes Brian sad.

Excluding people hurts their feelings.

This is NOT a theme. This is specific to the story and is the main idea.

This IS a theme. This is not specific to the story. It is universal and applies to everyone.
