close analysis of seven works by Lodovico Cigoli, Peter Paul Rubens, Francisco Pacheco and Diego Velázquez. She places these artists at the center of the astronomical debate showing that both before and after the invention of the telescope the proper evaluation of phenomena such as moon spots and the aurora borealis was commonly considered the province of the painter. Because these scientific hypotheses were complicated by their connection to Catholic doctrine, Reeves examines how the relationship between science and art and their mutual production of knowledge and authority must themselves be seen in a broader context of theological and political struggle.
