

Concepts of health

World Health Organization (1946) further defines health as complete physical, mental and social well-being, not merely negatively as the absence of disease or infirmity. This concept of health definition encompasses all aspects of human well-being because the mental (physiology), physical (the functionality of the physical body) and social (interaction with people) are all considered during medical evaluation, whether there is the presence of a disease or not since all these parameters must be stable for complete health and wellness. I do agree on this concept because for many years mental illness was not a measure of concern to some health care professionals in my country.

World Health Organization (1948) describes health as an essential condition for their attainment, and it is a fundamental right of every human of all creeds, race, age and gender to access and attain health. This inflection paves the way for underdeveloped nations, low-income earners and the poor to benefit from receiving health donations and medical care. For example, the recent pandemic of Covid-19, spurred developed countries for example, the United States to donate and deliver 200 million doses of its COVID-19 vaccines to more than 100 countries globally as at October 2021 (USAID, 2021). This has closed the gap of death and notable decrease of infection rates while ensuring equity and availability to all because it is a fundamental human right. This is a proof that governmental and individual cooperation in all levels in all the nations have become obligated to contribute to the health, security and peace of their people and people of other countries. Spread of diseases like COVID-19 is remarkably reduced, the economy of nations are recouping, poverty rate is reduced, increase in job opportunities, stability in mental wellness and social vices have minimized. These benefits make it more agreeable that all humans deserve to have the basic right to health. I agree with the Preamble notes that the achievement of any state in the promotion and protection of health is of value to all (World Health Organization, 1948).

According to Noack (1990), the concepts of lay people and professionals established differences between members of the public and health professionals. Lay people have the ideation that health is misconstrued by health professionals and so it is questioned to either be wrong or misguided and may be from the angle of ignorance or intentional misunderstanding which needs to be corrected through educational processes. If health professionals are educationally qualified, then this misconception by lay people is insignificant. Well, it did have a positive impact as it paved the way for acquiring traditional health education and unveiled the importance of individual health behavior. Health behavior is said to be "any behavior performed by a person, regardless of his or her perceived or actual health status, in order to protect, promote or maintain his or her health, whether or not that behavior is objectively effective toward that end" (Noack, 1990). This concept is quite interesting and inspiring because people are made to be self-reliant and intentional about their health behavior for lifestyle changes, taking of sensitive health decisions and health responsibility that will ultimately have positive impact on protecting their health. Open communication between the lay people and medical professionals for better understanding and health care management is important in this concept of health. During the quarantine, was there equitable medical care offered to every citizen in your nation?
