

WELCOME TO PRESCHOOL

This will be a fun year for your child, and I hope to make it an exciting one. Here is some information for the upcoming school year.

Schedule: Our day starts at 9:00 am with an opening table activity. Please bring your child no earlier than 8:55 pm as I am preparing the activity and for the morning.

Rules: In the classroom, I ask the children to be kind and safe while they are playing and learning. Please do not send in toys, stuffed animals or blankets. In the past, I have had trouble with these items being lost or broken. I have plenty of toys in my classroom for your child to play with.

Sickness: Please keep your child home if he/she is vomiting, has diarrhea, excessive coughing or has a fever. Your child needs to be free of these symptoms for 48 hours, without medication, before they can return. If your child is sick, please call (000) 000-000

Discipline: When a child misbehaves in my classroom, I use redirection. If a child hurts another child or abuses materials in my classroom, he/she will be asked to sit with me for a discussion. During our discussion, we will talk about what was done wrong and what he/she could do differently next time. If this problem persists, I will schedule a time to sit down with you to discuss the behavior and create an action plan.



Circle Time: During Circle Time, I will be introducing a letter of the Alphabet and number each week along with a color, a shape, and a nursery rhyme of the month. Also, we will discuss what the weather is like each day. Each child will have a job to do in the classroom and will rotate these on a weekly basis.

Snacks: Snack time is a fun time for the kids to talk to each other! I kindly ask you bring in healthy choices for your kiddo in his/her lunch box. There are many great options such as cheese sticks, lunch meat, fruit, veggies, applesauce or crackers. We have some children with nut allergies. Our school has a no nut and no candy policy. Please have your child bring a water bottle labeled with their name.

Birthdays: Birthdays are a fun time to celebrate your child! Don't worry! If your child has a summer birthday, I will celebrate their half birthday. You are more than welcome to send in store-bought treats per the school's policy for your child's birthday or half birthday. Because we are a nut-free school, please do not send any goodies with nuts. We do have some children that are severely allergic to nuts. As a special gift from me, I will send home a certificate, crown, and pencil.
