Story Sequencing with How/Why Questions

Book - Story Sequencing: picture & text sequencing with 10 picture pages - Sequencing with 10 Why/How questions with 10 picture pages - 100 words

1. Story Sequencing

As you look through the book together, read each page then ask simple questions about the relevant story sequencing picture and read the text aloud. Ask the children to answer in a random order and see if you can ask questions that by asking - "What?" Continue with the next 3-4 pictures until the end. Expect your child to be at least able to "find" all "find" with the 10 sets of sequencing pictures and text.

The Tiny Seed: Sequencing Activities

1. Sunflower Puzzle

Children sequencing puzzle with 10 pieces cut out from their own book. Each piece has a picture of a seedling and a question. They are to put the pieces in the correct order to tell the story of the seedling's growth.

2. Sequencing Plant Growth and Seasons

From their own book, children cut out 10 sets of 2 pictures to sequence. They are to put the pictures in the correct order to tell the story of the seedling's growth and the seasons.

The Tiny Seed: Some & Different

Sunflower and Cactus Picture with Subboard of Sequencing number 1-10

Present the Pictures of the sunflower and the cactus, pointing out the sun and rain and saying the different parts you can see. (leaves, roots, stem, leaves, flower etc.)

Then show the subboard and present the subboard with a choice of relevant statements for each number 1-10.

Read out the photograph of one of the two. I think and ask which picture is like it. Is that the same with the other one. I photograph. Show me the one. I ask children to the end.

Correct if the wrong one is chosen, by talking through.

Use this activity to support the questions on the story sequencing activity which began for:

- "What does a plant need to grow?"
- "How does a cactus grow in the desert?"
- "What's the same about a sunflower and a cactus?"
