1. Decide what sort of wound you are treating:

Diabetic ulcer: Open sore that often occurs on the plantar aspect of feet. Often starts as a blister. Most often in patients with decreased sensation. Prioritize: OFFLOADING

Venous ulcer: Irregular shaped and painful ulcer on lower extremities and ankles. Usually accompany hemosiderin staining and edema. Drain moderate to large amounts. Prioritize: COMPRESSION

Arterial ulcer: Regular shaped, punched out appearance, and painful. Usually on lower legs, top of feet, or toes. Late draining and bleeding than other ulcers. Prioritize: ABI AND VASCULAR CONSULT

2. Decide how deep the wound is:

Partial thickness: Extends into the epidermis and dermis

Full thickness: Extends through the dermis into subcutaneous or beyond into muscle, bone or tendon

3. Follow the instructions and care guidance chart below:

- Please take photos of all wounds before referral to Wound Care.
- Chronic wounds: Order ABIs for all significant chronic wounds (> 3 weeks duration) if not done in last 6 months.
- Venous disease: With evidence of venous disease, encourage compression and elevation using Comprilan bandage/stocking, Tubigrip, or elastic bandage).
- Diabetic wounds: Take pressure off plantar diabetic wounds with appropriate footwear if available. If not, try to keep non-weight bearing.
- All dressings should be changed at least once a day. Wet-to-dry dressings should be changed twice a day. If there is no improvement in one week, refer to the Wound Clinic. If you have questions, contact Linnea Briggs, ARNP or Nichole Shoemaker, RN via Epic or Vitals.

Tubigrip is a temporary tube sock used for mild compression
Xeroform is a non-adherent wound dressing with mild antimicrobial properties.

Iodosorb is a sterile antimicrobial dressing formulation of Cadexomer iodine. Cleans it by absorbing fluids, removing exudate, slough and debris and forming a gel over the wound surface
