Vv., 2014-12-11T00:00:00+01:00 Time without becoming is the text of a lecture Quentin Meillassoux gave at the Middlesex University in May 2008 He makes a summary of the arguments he employed in After Finitude to overcome correlationism from the inside and to dismiss philosophies of becoming such as absolute idealism and vitalism In particular he explains the specificity of his speculative materialism by supporting the thesis of the reciprocalexteriority of matter and mind In her contribution Anna Longo challenges this perspective taking into account the issue of the genesis of the transcendental in Gilles Deleuze's philosophy Heidegger and the Emergence of the Question of Being Jesús Adrián Escudero, 2014-12-18 Heidegger and the Emergence of the Question of Being offers a new updated and comprehensive introduction to Heidegger's development and his early confrontation with philosophical tradition theology neo Kantianism vitalism hermeneutics and phenomenology up to the publication of Being and Time in 1927 The main thread is the genealogy of the question of the meaning of being Alongside the most recent scholarly research this book takes into account the documentary richness of Heidegger's first Freiburg 1919 1923 and Marburg 1923 1928 lectures conferences treatises and letters and addresses the thematic and methodological richness of this period of Heidegger's intellectual life and offers a coherent and unified interpretation of his earlier work. This book conveys Heidegger's thought in a well organized impartial manner without deviating too far from Heideggerian vocabulary It will be invaluable for upper level undergraduates graduate students of philosophy studying phenomenology continental and German philosophy

Realism features a range of scholars working at the intersection of literary poetics and philosophy It considers how the writing of the Romantic era reconceptualizes the human imagination the natural world and the language that correlates them in radical ways that can advance current speculative debates concerning new ontologies and new materialisms In their wide ranging examinations of canonical and non canonical romantic writers the scholars gathered here rethink the connections between the human and non human world to envision speculative modes of social being and ecological politics Spanning historical and national frameworks from historical romanticism to contemporary post romantic ecology and from British and German romanticism to global modernity these essays examine life in all its varied forms in and beyond the Anthropocene

The five texts included here are What Is History Anxiety and Reason The Eclipse of Reality The Moving Soul and The Beginning and the Beyond In their introduction to the volume Thomas A Hollweck and Paul Caringella place these writings in their proper context and discuss the ways in which they reveal clues to the evolution of Voegelin s thought In What Is History Voegelin considers the development of a transcendent structure of history while simultaneously rejecting the notion that history can have a universal meaning Anxiety and Reason focuses on Voegelin's critically important theory of historiogenesis which links events in pragmatic history with legendary and mythical events leading back to the beginning of the cosmic order In The Eclipse of Reality Voegelin presents a critique of modernity by analyzing the work of Sartre Schiller Comte and others The Moving Soul a thought experiment inspired by a remark Henry Margenau makes in The Nature of Physical Reality attempts to reformulate the connections between physics and myth The most important of these essays is Me Beginning and the Beyond Here Voegelin meditates on the universality of experience formed by the tension of existence under God Publication of these previously unpublished writings will enable scholars to trace the genesis of many of the concerns that occupied Voegelin during a period in which the conception of his main work was undergoing frequent and perhaps fundamental changes
