Tips to write an autobiography:

Autobiographical Writing and British Literature 1783-1834 James Treadwell, 2005-01-20 The word autobiography is a late eighteenth century coinage yet by 1826 it was used as the title for a multi volume anthology of self writing and in 1834 Thomas Carlyle wrote of these Autobiographical times of ours Over the course of those few decades readers and writers came to recognize and name a new genre This book is the first full study of the phenomenon examining both the conditions and the practice of autobiographical writing in Romantic literature Historians of autobiography have often pointed to the turn of the nineteenth century as a pivotal moment In Rousseau and De Quincey s Confessions Wordsworth s Prelude and other canonical documents it has been argued self writing begins to serve the purpose of expressing the individuality autonomy and interiority of the self A more wide ranging view of the actual state of autobiography at the time exposes this narrative as a misrepresentation Self writing does gain a new kind of prominence around 1800 not however because it articulates Romantic ideologies of selfhood but because it becomes a focus of scrutiny and of contention The decades of the Romantic period identified themselves as Autobiographical times but did so anxiously This book asks what forms did that recognition and that anxiety take within the literary culture of the period What did autobiography mean to Romantic readers and writers How do autobiographical texts of the period reflect express and negotiate these conditions As well as reading a wide variety of those documents with single chapters devoted to works by Coleridge Byron and Lamb Treadwell examines writing on and around autobiography essays reviews and other forms of commentary By preserving a continuous relation between the texts and their contexts this book offers the first proper study of what is actually meant by Romantic autobiography

The Postethnic Literary Florian Sedlmeier, 2014-12-11 The book explores the discursive and theoretical conditions for conceptualizing the postethnic literary It historicizes US multicultural and postcolonial studies as institutionalized discursive formations which constitute a paratext that regulates the reception of literary texts according to the paradigm of representativeness Rather than following that paradigm the study offers an alternative framework by rereading contemporary literary texts for their investment in literary form By means of self reflective intermedial transpositions the writings of Sherman Alexie Chang rae Lee and Jamaica Kincaid insist upon a differentiation between the representation of cultural sign systems or subject positions and the dramatization of individual gestures of authorship As such they form a postethnic literary constellation further probed in the epilogue of the study focused on Dave Eggers

Good, 2014-08-01 First published in 1988 this title is a study of the essay as a literary genre not just in terms of its general intellectual and literary history but as an exploration of the creative possibilities of the form The rise of the essay is discussed in relation to the rise of the novel and the emergence of empiricism in science but the main focus of Graham Good s study is on the inner workings of the essay itself Drawing on criticism by Adorno and Lukacs Graham Good presents the genre as an expression of individualism freed from tradition and authority in which the self constructs itself and its object through
