The Heinrich Prophecy:

Prophecy and the Battle for Spiritual Authority, 1360-1400 Frances Courtney Kneupper, 2025-07-02 The end of the fourteenth century was a time of upheaval and contested authority among the traditional institutions of medieval Europe In response to these conditions a number of people began to claim their own authority as prophets speaking the word of God They came from outside of the clerical elite and were mostly women and reformers This book examines the battle over authority which ensued Prophetic women and other non elites successfully used prophecy to exert influence and to enter the corridors of power while educated male clerics insinuated that prophecy was the product of demonic influence and therefore a hazard to the public Surprisingly a third faction also emerged an international network of clerical men who wrote in support of female prophecy This volume traces the arguments made by these three groups the clashes that erupted and the long term impacts of this battle on ideas of spiritual authority

through the words of his prophets When the prophets are silenced the people easily lose their way What happened after the incarnation death and resurrection of Christ Did God fall silent The dominant position in Christian theology is that prophecy did indeed cease at some point in the past if not with the Old Testament prophets then with John the Baptist with Jesus with the last apostle or with the closure of the canon of the New Testament Nevertheless throughout the history of Christianity there have always been acclaimed saints and mystics most of them women who displayed prophetic traits In recent years the charismatic revival in both Protestant and Catholic circles has once again raised the question of the place and function of prophecy in Christianity Scholarly theological attitudes toward Christian prophecy range from modest recognition to contempt Mainstream systematic theology both Protestant and Catholic has mostly marginalized or ignored the gift of prophecy In this book however Niels Christian Hvidt argues that prophecy has persisted in Christianity as an inherent and continuous feature in the life of the church Prophecy never died he argues but rather proved its dynamism by mutating to meet new historical conditions He presents a comprehensive history of prophecy from ancient Israel to the present and closely examines the development of the theological discourse that surrounds it Throughout though there is always an awareness of the critical discernment required when evaluating the charism of prophecy The debate about prophecy Hvidt shows leads to some profound insights about the very nature of Christianity and the church For example some have argued that Christianity is a perfect state and that all that is required for salvation is acceptance of its doctrines Others have emphasized how God continues to intervene and guide his people onto the right path as the full implementation of God's salvation in Christ is still far away This is the position that Hvidt forcefully and persuasively defends and develops in this ambitious and important work

The Powers of Prophecy is an original attempt to investigate the subject of medieval eschatological prophecies: how and in what circumstances they were written; how they circulated; what they told people about the future; and how they were received. Although scholars have studied the ideas of a few outstanding medieval prophetic thinkers or the role of prophecies in heretical movements and popular insurrections, up to now there has been no attempt to study the most commonplace medieval prophetic ideas as they were communicated in the most frequently copied and widely read anonymous prophetic texts. Dedicated to pursuing the typical, Lerner's book traces the fortunes of an eschatological prophecy that was first written around 1240 and thereafter circulated throughout Western Europe for more than four centuries. Originally composed as a response to the Mongol onslaught, the prophecy was resurrected and reconceived to apply to other crises such as the fall of the Holy Land, the Black Death, and the Protestant Reformation. Although it was supposed to have descended from on high, allegedly being a message written by a disembodied moving hand over an altar during mass, countless scribes felt no qualms about recirculating the text with substantial changes. Among the many who took note of the prophecy in one or another of its numerous guises were the scholastic theologian John of Paris, the Infante Peter, a prince of the house of Aragon, John Clyn, an Irish monk who entered it into his chronicle shortly before dying of the bubonic plague, and Martin Luther.

John Calvin as Sixteenth-Century Prophet Jon Balserak, 2014-02-06

John Calvin as Sixteenth Century Prophet examines Calvin's sense of vocation. Jon Balserak argues that Calvin believed himself to be a prophet placed over nations and kingdoms to tear down and destroy to build and to plant. Jer 1:10: "With this authority Calvin pursued an expansionist agenda which blended the religious, political, and social towards making France upon which he turned his attentions especially after 1555." Protestant Beginning with an analysis of the two trajectories of thought existing within Christian discourse on prophecy from the patristic to the Early Modern era, this study goes on to locate Calvin within a non-mystical, non-apocalyptic prophetic tradition that focused on scriptural interpretation. Balserak demonstrates how Calvin developed a plan to win France for the gospel, a plan which included the possibility of armed conflict. To pursue his designs, Calvin trained prophets who were sent into France to labor intensely to undermine the king's authority on the grounds that he supported idolatry, convince the French Reformed congregations that they were

already in a war with him and prepare them for a possible military uprising An additional part of this plan saw Calvin search for a French noble willing to support the evangelical religion even if it meant initiating a coup Calvin began ruminating over these ideas in the 1550s or possibly earlier In this analysis the war which commenced in 1562 represents the culmination of Calvin's years of preparation

The Reformation of the Literal Erik Lundeen, 2025-01-23 What does it mean to read the Bible literally Recent debates on the Protestant reformers have focused on whether they were stridently literal interpreters or maintained a place for allegorical readings However in this nuanced book Lundeen argues that the question of what in fact constituted the Bible's literal sense was also a key question in early modern debates There is no clean binary of literal versus allegorical instead reformers subtly produced a variety of competing literalisms There was not one literal sense in the Reformation but many To make this case Lundeen comparatively analyzes Reformation era commentaries on the prophet Isaiah He further highlights the little known but influential works of the Basel reformer Johannes Oecolampadius who was the first Christian to publish commentaries on most of the biblical prophets in the sixteenth century By placing Oecolampadius in conversation with a host of his better known Christian and Jewish predecessors and contemporaries this book reframes a central aspect of Reformation era biblical exegesis while also providing a constructive resource for those who seek to read the Bible's ancient prophets as Christian scripture today

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
