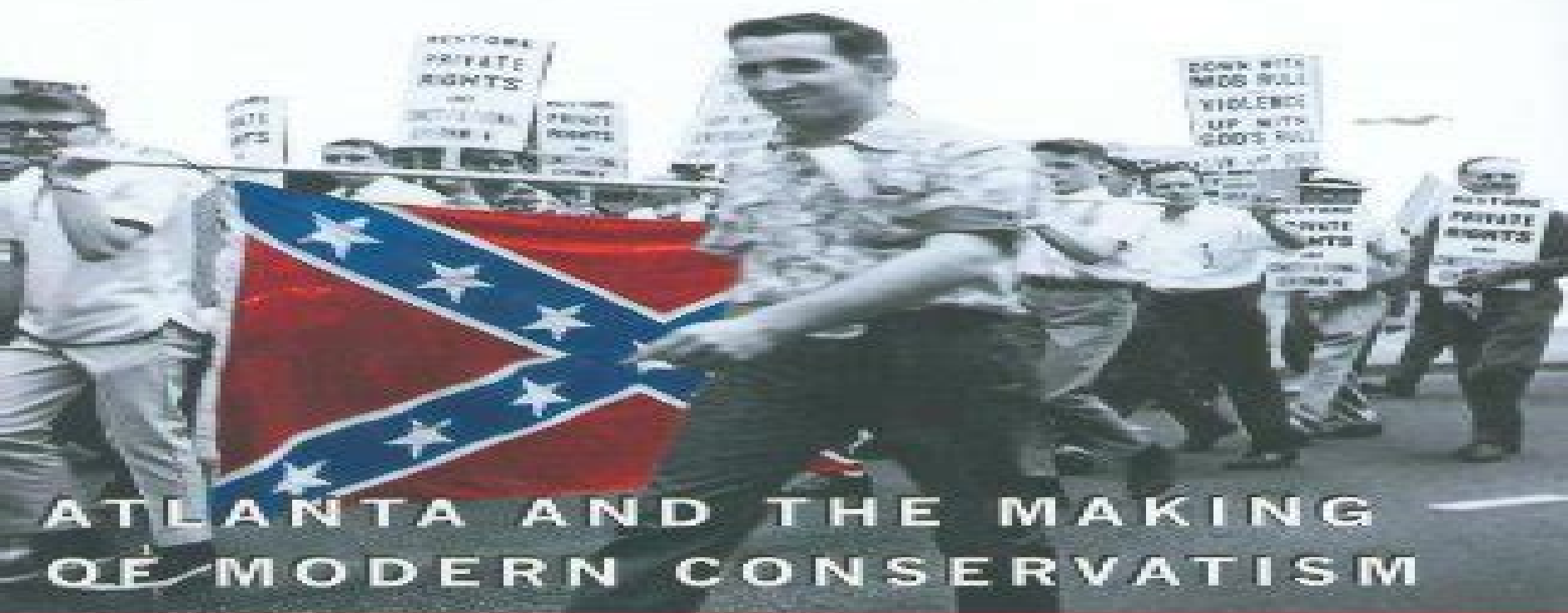

Williams, 2012-11-05 In *Gendered Politics in the Modern South* Keira V Williams uses the Susan Smith case to analyze what she calls the new sexism found in the agenda of the budding neoconservative movement of the 1990s Just days after Smith's confession to killing her children soon to be Speaker of the House Newt Gingrich linked Smith's behavior to the 1960s counterculture and to Lyndon Johnson's Great Society programs At the same time the assault on liberal social causes gained momentum as the media declared the death of feminism and a crisis in masculinity In response to this perceived crisis Williams argues a distinct code of gender discrimination developed one that sought to reassert a traditional form of white male power at the end of the twentieth century

**The Closet and the Cul-de-Sac** Clayton Howard, 2019-02-18 The right to privacy is a pivotal concept in the culture wars that have galvanized American politics for the past several decades It has become a rallying point for political issues ranging from abortion to gay liberation to sex education Yet this notion of privacy originated not only from legal arguments nor solely from political movements on the left or the right but instead from ambivalent moderates who valued both personal freedom and the preservation of social norms In *The Closet and the Cul de Sac* Clayton Howard chronicles the rise of sexual privacy as a fulcrum of American cultural politics Beginning in the 1940s public officials pursued an agenda that both promoted heterosexuality and made sexual privacy one of the state's key promises to its citizens The 1944 G I Bill for example excluded gay veterans and enfranchised married ones in its dispersal of housing benefits At the same time officials required secluded bedrooms in new suburban homes and created educational campaigns designed to teach children respect for parents privacy In the following decades measures such as these helped to concentrate middle class families in the suburbs and gay men and lesbians in cities In the 1960s and 1970s the gay rights movement invoked privacy to attack repressive antigay laws while social conservatives criticized tolerance for LGBTQ people as an assault on their own privacy Many self identified moderates however used identical rhetoric to distance themselves from both the discriminatory language of the religious right and the perceived excesses of the gay freedom struggle Using the Bay Area as a case study Howard places these moderates at the center of postwar American politics and shows how the region's burgeoning suburbs reacted to increasing gay activism in San Francisco *The Closet and the Cul de Sac* offers specific examples of the ways in which government policies shaped many Americans attitudes about sexuality and privacy and the ways in which citizens mobilized to reshape them

**One in Christ** Karen J. Johnson, 2018-07-02 Today the images of Catholic priests and nuns marching in 1960s civil rights protests are iconic Their cassocks and habits clothed the movement in sacred garments But by the time of those protests Catholic Civil Rights activism already had a long history one in which the religious leadership of the Church played at best a supporting role Instead it was laypeople first African Americans and then as they found white partners black and white Catholics working together who shaped the movement regular people who in self consciously Catholic ways devoted their time energy and prayers to what they called interracial justice a vision of economic social religious and civil

equality Karen J Johnson tells the story of Catholic interracial activism from the bottom up through the lives of a group of women and men in Chicago who struggled with one another their Church and their city to try to live their Catholic faith in a new and what they thought was more complete and true way Black activists found a handful of white laypeople some of whom later became priests who believed in their vision of a universal church in the segregated city Together they began to fight for interracial justice all while knitted together in sometimes contentious friendship as members of the Mystical Body of Christ In the end not only had Catholic activists lived out their faith as active participants in the long civil rights movement and learned how to cooperate and indeed love across racial lines but they had changed the practice of Catholicism They broke down the hierarchy that placed priests above the laity and crossed the parish boundaries that defined urban Catholicism Chicago was a vital laboratory in what became a national story One in Christ traces the development of Catholic interracial activism revealing the ways religion and race combined both to enforce racial hierarchies and to tear them down and demonstrating that we cannot understand race and civil rights in the North without accounting for religion **Urban**

**Nightlife** Reuben A. Herbin-Triant,2019-05-28 White supremacists determined what African Americans could do and where they could go in the Jim Crow South but they were less successful in deciding where black people could live because different groups of white supremacists did not agree on the question of residential segregation In Threatening Property Elizabeth A Herbin Triant investigates early twentieth century campaigns for residential segregation laws in North Carolina to show how the version of white supremacy supported by middle class white people differed from that supported by

the elites Class divides prevented Jim Crow from expanding to the extent that it would require separate neighborhoods for black and white southerners as in apartheid South Africa Herbin Triant details the backlash against the economic successes of African Americans among middle class whites who claimed that they wished to protect property values and so campaigned for residential segregation laws both in the city and the countryside where their actions were modeled on South Africa s Natives Land Act White elites blocked these efforts primarily because it was against their financial interest to remove the black workers that they employed in their homes farms and factories Herbin Triant explores what the split over residential segregation laws reveals about competing versions of white supremacy and about the position of middling whites in a region dominated by elite planters and businessmen An illuminating work of social and political history Threatening Property puts class front and center in explaining conflict over the expansion of segregation laws into private property Creating the Suburban School Advantage John L. Rury, 2020-04-15 Creating the Suburban School Advantage explains how American suburban school districts gained a competitive edge over their urban counterparts John L Rury provides a national overview of the process focusing on the period between 1950 and 1980 and presents a detailed study of metropolitan Kansas City a region representative of trends elsewhere While big city districts once were widely seen as superior and attracted families seeking the best educational opportunities for their children suburban school systems grew rapidly in the post World War II era as middle class and more affluent families moved to those communities As Rury relates at the same time economically dislocated African Americans migrated from the South to center city neighborhoods testing the capacity of urban institutions As demographic trends drove this urban suburban divide a suburban ethos of localism contributed to the socioeconomic exclusion that became a hallmark of outlying school systems School districts located wholly or partly within the municipal boundaries of Kansas City Missouri make for revealing cases that illuminate our understanding of these national patterns As Rury demonstrates struggles to achieve greater educational equity and desegregation in urban centers contributed to so called white flight and what Senator Daniel Patrick Moynihan considered to be a crisis of urban education in 1965 Despite the often valiant efforts made to serve inner city children and bolster urban school districts this exodus Rury cogently argues created a new metropolitan educational hierarchy a mirror image of the urban centric model that had prevailed before World War II The stubborn perception that suburban schools are superior based on test scores and budgets has persisted into the twenty first century and instantiates today s metropolitan landscape of social economic and educational inequality

*Whiteness Interrupted* Marcus Bell, 2021-06-28 In *Whiteness Interrupted* Marcus Bell presents a revealing portrait of white teachers in majority black schools in which he examines the limitations of understandings of how white racial identity is formed Through in depth interviews with dozens of white teachers from a racially segregated urban school district in Upstate New York Bell outlines how whiteness is constructed based on localized interactions and takes a different form in predominantly black spaces He finds that in response to racial stress in a difficult teaching environment white teachers

conceptualized whiteness as a stigmatized category predicated on white victimization When discussing race outside majority black spaces Bell s subjects characterized American society as postracial in which race seldom affects outcomes Conversely in discussing their experiences within predominantly black spaces they rejected the idea of white privilege often angrily and instead focused on what they saw as the racial privilege of blackness Throughout Bell underscores the significance of white victimization narratives in black spaces and their repercussions as the United States becomes a majority minority society

Rolph,2018-06-04 In Resisting Equality Stephanie R Rolph examines the history of the Citizens Council an organization committed to coordinating opposition to desegregation and black voting rights In the first comprehensive study of this racist group Rolph follows the Citizens Council from its establishment in the Mississippi Delta through its expansion into other areas of the country and its success in incorporating elements of its agenda into national politics to its formal dissolution in 1989 Founded in 1954 two months after the Brown v Board of Education decision by the U S Supreme Court the Council spread rapidly in its home state of Mississippi Initially the organization relied on local chapters to monitor signs of black activism and take action to suppress that activism through economic and sometimes violent means As the decade came to a close however the Council s influence expanded into Mississippi s political institutions silencing white moderates and facilitating a wave of terror that severely obstructed black Mississippians participation in the civil rights movement As the Citizens Council reached the peak of its power in Mississippi its ambitions extended beyond the South Alliances with like minded organizations across the country supplemented waning influence at home and the Council movement found itself in league with the earliest sparks of conservative ascension cultivating consistent messages of grievance against minority groups and urging the necessity of white unity Much more than a local arm of white terror the Council s work intersected with anticommunism conservative ideology grassroots activism and Radical Right organizations that facilitated its journey from the margins into mainstream politics Perhaps most crucially Rolph examines the extent to which the organization survived the successes of the civil rights movement and found continued relevance even after the Council s campaign to preserve state sanctioned forms of white supremacy ended in defeat Using the Council s own materials papers from its political allies oral histories and newspaper accounts Resisting Equality illuminates the motives and mechanisms of this destructive group **Race and Education in New Orleans** Walter Stern,2018-05-04 Surveying the two centuries that preceded Jim Crow s demise Race and Education in New Orleans traces the course of the city s education system from the

colonial period to the start of school desegregation in 1960 This timely historical analysis reveals that public schools in New Orleans both suffered from and maintained the racial stratification that characterized urban areas for much of the twentieth century Walter C Stern begins his account with the mid eighteenth century kidnapping and enslavement of Marie Justine Sirnir who eventually secured her freedom and played a major role in the development of free black education in the Crescent City As Sirnir s story and legacy illustrate schools such as the one she envisioned were central to the black antebellum understanding of race citizenship and urban development Black communities fought tirelessly to gain better access to education which gave rise to new strategies by white civilians and officials who worked to maintain and strengthen the racial status quo even as they conceded to demands from the black community for expanded educational opportunities The friction between black and white New Orleanians continued throughout the nineteenth century and well into the twentieth when conflicts over land and resources sharply intensified Stern argues that the post Reconstruction reorganization of the city into distinct black and white enclaves marked a new phase in the evolution of racial disparity segregated schools gave rise to segregated communities which in turn created structural inequality in housing that impeded desegregation s capacity to promote racial justice By taking a long view of the interplay between education race and urban change Stern underscores the fluidity of race as a social construct and the extent to which the Jim Crow system evolved through a dynamic though often improvisational process A vital and accessible history Race and Education in New Orleans provides a comprehensive look at the ways the New Orleans school system shaped the city s racial and urban landscapes
