- “Over-complicated, lengthy and tick-box assessment+recording system.”
- Child protection seen as ‘Cinderella Service’
- Too many authorities failed to adopt his reforms following Victoria Climbié report in 2000
  
- “It seems like they have to do all this form filling. Their bosses make them do it but it makes them forget about us” – 16-year-old in care
