

Active vs. Passive

Active Euthanasia

- Something is done to intentionally bring about the patient's death
- Patient or someone else can perform or assist
- Not currently legal (except in Oregon and outside the U.S.)
- Seen by some as a morally problematic form of killing

Passive Euthanasia

- Something needed for continued patient survival is intentionally withheld, which facilitates the patient's death via "natural" causes
- Can include non-treatment or withdrawal of nourishment or hydration
- Usually instigated by medical staff
- Currently legal and regarded as acceptable within medicine
- Seen as a less morally problematic omission
