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The Modern Language Association (MLA) has moved toward a less-directive and individualized approach in formatting research papers with the release of the *MLA Handbook* 8th Edition (hereinafter "MLA-8"). For example, MLA repeatedly refers to professors' rights to establish unique formatting requirements ("MLA Style Center"). Accordingly, the formatting guidelines herein are basic recommendations, but professors' requirements, if and when those differ.

ALL content in the paper will be of the same font style (TIMES or ARIAL) and font size (12). This includes the HEADER, Title page, and the Works Cited page.

The *MLA-8* itself does not explain how to set up or lay out the "format" of the pages in a research paper. Rather, MLA chose instead to maintain the same guidelines as published in the
