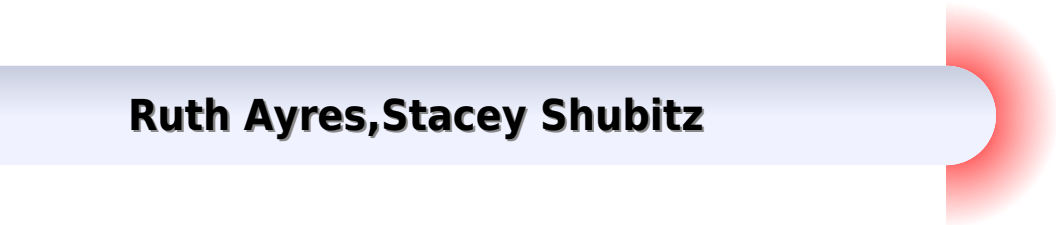

upstart crow The anomalous existence of two bodies of work exhibiting distinct poetic voices printed under one man's name suggests a fascinating possibility Could William Shakespeare have written the apocryphal plays while serving as a front man for the poet in purple robes a hidden court poet who was much admired by a literary coterie in the 1590s And could the poet in purple robes have been the great poet and statesman Thomas Sackville 1536-1608 a previously overlooked authorship candidate who is an excellent fit to the Shakespearean glass slipper Both of these scenarios are well supported by literary and historical records many of which have not been previously considered in the context of the Shakespeare authorship debate
